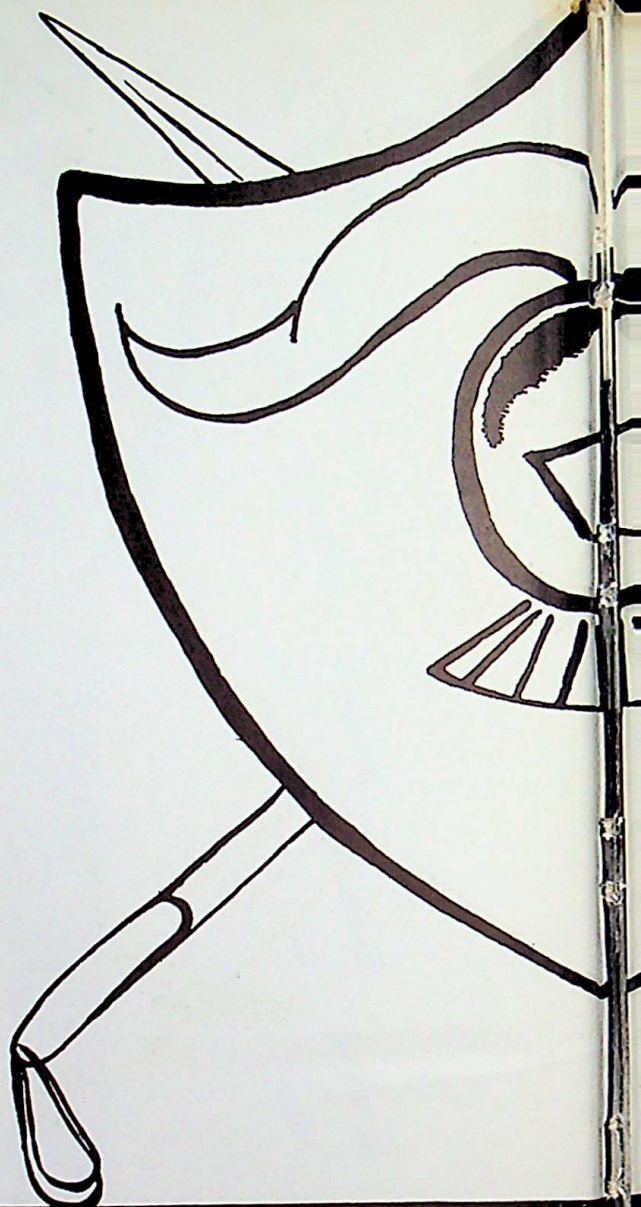

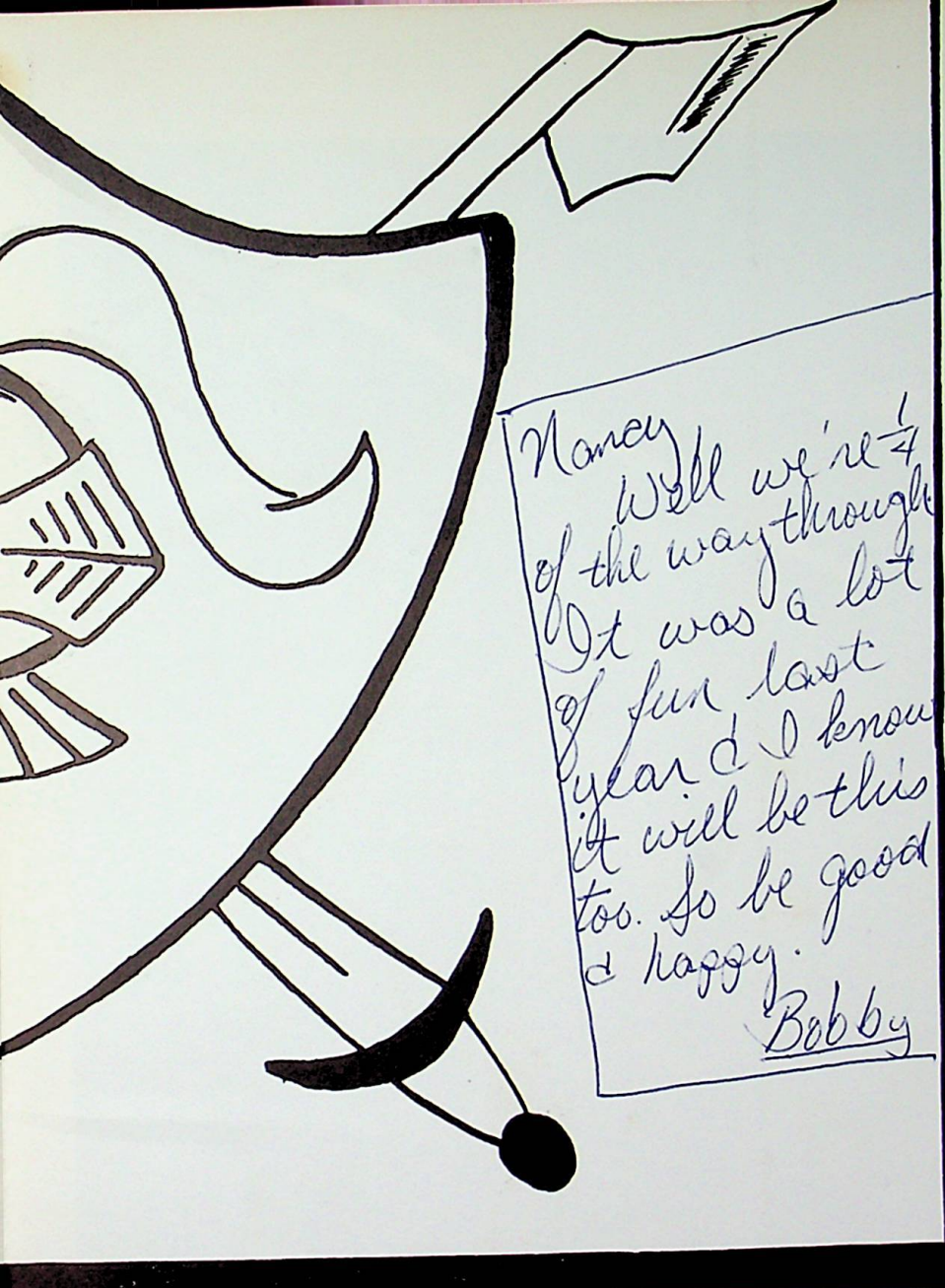

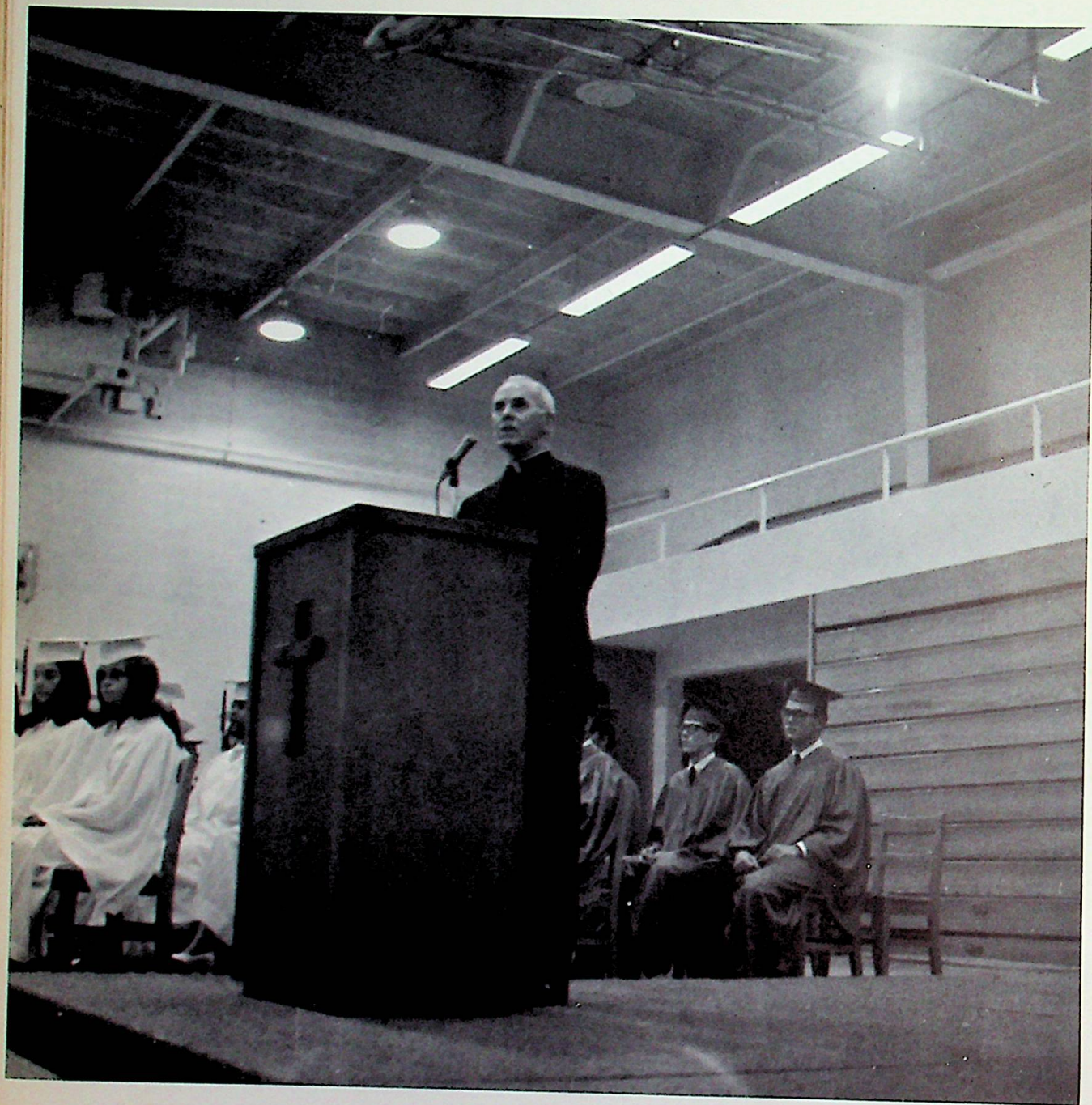

## *Father Connor*

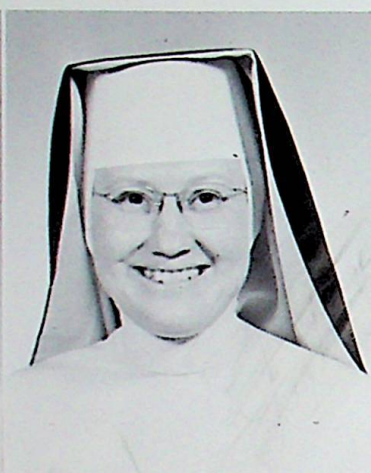

Bishop Byrne's Red Knights raced to a 38-0 halftime lead and then coasted to an easy 58-0 victory at Barret's Chapel last night.

Eddie Boyle scored three touchdowns for the Red Knights, who set their record at 2-2. The Red Knight half-back went over from the 14 and 11 and capped his performance with a 44-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Mark Prudhomme. Mike Mallette and George Simpson closed out the Bishop Byrne scoring with Simpson going three yards and Mallette sprinting 44.
